The Bible and You!

The Bible, the most sold book throughout history.

I suppose I could ask the question, why do you have a bible? Do you apply it to your Christian journey? Is it just adorning your bookshelf? Having attending the bible class that restarted on 7th September, there was discussion around a question that asked why the scriptures were given to us. It was interesting to hear the responses from those who attended and the answer that was given. As was mentioned in the last newsletter, the bible is a guide for us in how to live our life. God gave us the Bible so we could know how to be faithful to Him. His word gives us general guidelines that are applicable regardless of time, place, or person. Now that we know beyond a doubt we are God's children, this can influence our daily lives, our self-worth, our relationships, and so much more.

But wouldn't it be nice to have some specifics? What kinds of things should we do with this new perspective? Fortunately the Bible is helpful here, too. While the culture was vastly different at the time it was written, humanity was dealing with the same struggles that persist today: pride, greed, guilt, hate, fear, etc.

All those struggles are the same sin, just wearing different clothes. Each one represents a form of selfishness—valuing one's own life and preferences above others' and choosing that same self-interest over God's loving guidance.

It's not just in Genesis; the whole Bible is about choice. It's like a reference book to help us make better choices each day.

In Exodus we have the Ten Commandments —probably the most famous "rules" in the Bible. (<u>Exodus 20:1-17</u>) That's understandable, since many of today's laws reflect those same principles. Don't steal, don't murder, don't cheat on your spouse... those are all commandments. But the rest of the commandments take things a bit deeper. They reflect where God's place should be in your life, how you should regard your family, and an invitation to experience the blessing of the Sabbath.

In essence, the Bible from when it was created to the present day gives the information needed, whatever the situation, although the culture may have changed. Quite simply put, it is our guide. We can see that just from the 10 commandments it gives us all we need to live a healthy wholesome Christian life.

I would encourage you to attend the Bible class that is held on Sabbaths 4—5pm, so you can be part of an in depth discussion, asking questions on all things related to the bible. Remember, God never leaves us to figure it out on our own hence 'The Bible and You'.

Money Matters!

On 28th October at 6pm via Zoom, the Education department will be putting on a financial literacy workshop for the young people, to help them focus on managing their money well and being able to make sound financial decisions that will play an important role into and through their adult life.

What about you? (the older member) Are you managing your money well? Here are a few tips, with bible back up, regarding money management.

Make a Budget and Stick to It

Counting the cost by making a budget before every month begins ensures you won't run out of money till the next pay day. Jesus talked about the importance of making a budget while teaching his followers in Luke 14:28–30. He asked, "For which of you, intending to build a tower, does not sit down first and count the cost, whether he has enough to finish it—lest, after he has laid the foundation, and is not able to finish, all who see it begin to mock him, saying, 'This man began to build and was not able to finish'?"

The answer is simple....BUDGET!

Live on less than you make

This enables you to SAVE. Proverbs 21:20 says, "In the house of the wise are stores of choice food and oil, but a foolish man devours all he has." Also, it is advisable to have an emergency fund of between 3 to 6 months worth of your expenses saved.

Invest and Build Wealth

Saving money over time allows you to build wealth. Proverbs 13:22 says, "A good man leaves an inheritance to his children's children." Investing does not mean to buy into some kind of get-rich-quick scheme as the bible points out in Proverbs 28:20, "He who hastens to be rich will not go unpunished." The idea is to follow the biblical plan of building wealth - namely budgeting, living on less than you make, saving and repeating these steps over and over again.

Generosity

By building wealth you can be generous. Being generous isn't just something God *wants* us to do. It's part of how He *made* us. Giving is in our DNA. 2 Corinthians 9:7 says, *"So let each one give as he purposes in his heart, not grudgingly or of necessity; for God loves a cheerful giver."* We know that it is a blessing to give rather than to receive.

Debt??

This is not good. Proverbs 22:7 says, "The rich rule over the poor, and the borrower is slave to the lender." Translation: If you owe someone money, they'll control your life until you pay it back. Although there are times when this is unavoidable, such as buying a house, have a plan in place to pay it all back.

PROSTATE CANCER - What is it?

Prostate cancer can develop when cells in the prostate start to grow in an uncontrolled way.

Some prostate cancer grows too slowly to cause any problems or affect how long you live. Because of this, many men with prostate cancer will never need any treatment.

But some prostate cancer grows quickly and is more likely to spread. This is more likely to cause problems and needs treatment to stop it spreading.

Are you at risk?

In the UK, about 1 in 8 men will get prostate cancer in their lifetime. Prostate cancer mainly affects men **over 50**, and your risk increases with age. The risk is even higher for black men and men with a family history of prostate cancer.

What are the symptoms?

Symptoms of prostate cancer can include:

- needing to pee more frequently, often during the night
- needing to rush to the toilet
- difficulty in starting to pee (hesitancy)
- straining or taking a long time while peeing
- weak flow
- feeling that your bladder has not emptied fully
- blood in urine or blood in semen

These symptoms do not always mean you have prostate cancer. Many men's prostates get larger as they get older because of a non-cancerous condition called benign prostate enlargement.

Signs that the cancer may have spread include bone and back pain, a loss of appetite, pain in the testicles and unintentional weight loss.

What to do now?

If you have symptoms that could be caused by prostate cancer, or have any questions needing more information, then you should visit your GP.

The Stoke Newington Seventh-day Adventist Church can trace its roots from its humble beginnings in 1965, in the home of former members at Mildenhall Road, Lower Clapton. It was there that Bible Studies and Prayer Meetings took place attended by around 12 people.

This group, drawn from the Holloway Church and the former New Gallery Centre, soon grew large enough to seek alternative accommodation. The group stepped out in faith to a rented building – The Friends Meeting Hall (our current site). As time went on, a request was made to the South England Conference for a pastor and this group was placed under the pastoral care of Pastor Nicholson.

By the 1st January 1966, the membership grew to about 60 and the Stoke Newington group was organized into a church.

50+ years later, we are still here - Thanking God!! Of course over the years the membership has grown and people have come and gone. Whoever has been in membership of Stoke Newington, previously, currently and to come, will continue to be a beacon of light in our community.
